

## Our Finances

It costs over £430 each day which amounts to more than £3,000 a week to keep St Stephen Walbrook open and providing activities in the Parish. As a Grade one listed building, the church is expensive to maintain. We receive no grants from the Government or other sources but greatly appreciate the financial donations made by some businesses in the Parish. To continue and develop all the activities we currently provide for individuals, businesses and other organisations in the City, we need an additional £30,000 each year.

## Time, Talents and Treasure

Each of us has time, talents and treasure which could be given out of gratitude and to help this church. Will you help in some way? How much time have we got? We don't know, so we must use it all wisely. Each of us has special qualities, skills and talents. Could your talents be used for the work of St Stephen Walbrook?

Could you offer your time and talents for tasks such as administration (including data entry, Discover & explore rotas, Parish Rate, publicity), bell ringing, cleaning, counting collections, hospitality (special events and/or Thursday Eucharists), IT, leading prayers, London Internet Church, marketing, PCC membership, preparing invitations, publicity, reading the Bible in services, sidesperson (welcoming others to services), Start:Stop advertising, among other tasks?

Giving financially to church is a practical act of support for St Stephen Walbrook. Could you:

- Begin **giving** or **review** what you already give and increase it if you can (even a small increase adds up over a year)
- Join the national **Parish Giving Scheme** which allows St Stephen Walbrook to improve cashflow from its donations and reduces the amount of administration that is needed in making Gift Aid claims. Through this Scheme you give to the PCC by **Direct Debit** and can, if you wish, increase your giving by inflation each year. You sign a declaration so that Gift Aid is automatically added to the amount you give.
- Join the planned giving scheme by making a commitment to give by **standing order**. A standing order enables St Stephen Walbrook to plan and means the cost of our ministry is supported, whether you can be in church or not.
- Signing a **Gift Aid** form if you pay tax. Donations under Gift Aid are worth 25p more for every £1 given.
- Leaving a gift in your **will** to support the future of St Stephen Walbrook.


